To follow is a letter from Scott to Council:

“Dear Emily and members of the Church Council:

This letter is to inform you that I will resign my position and retire effective December 31, 2020.

I will be 66 in June and have served Holy Trinity for 34 years. Rev. Gerry Rickel recognized my work as a call to Music Ministry, and I was installed on Holy Cross Day, September 15, 1986. I have been thinking about retiring and, to be honest, a new pastoral vacancy during the pandemic did serve as one impetus in making this decision. I have worked with nine pastors and survived five vacancies over the years, during which I had many additional responsibilities. Two contemporaries and fellow singers in *Harmonium Choral Society* have passed away suddenly this fall. These losses also have caused me to evaluate and think about life.

Holy Trinity has been our family’s spiritual home for 40 years, and this has not been an easy decision. Our worship has brought me much joy and I am so appreciative of the congregation’s support. A special note of thanks to everyone who ever sang in the choir or played an instrument in worship. Your dedication means so much to me.”

Decide to Give Sacrificially

Little has ever been accomplished without sacrifice. This is true in our homes, our work, our church, our country. Sacrifice is a necessary component of successful living.

And so it is with the Christian life and faith. Our salvation cost God the cross. Bonhoeffer rightly said there is no cheap grace.

Much of church giving is only token giving, averaging about two percent of income. No wonder there is so little joy or satisfaction in it! It requires no sacrifice! We have given only what we could easily afford, what we would not really miss.

Experience has shown that giving, to be meaningful and joyful, has to be sacrificial! Each will have to determine what amount or percentage is sacrificial for his or her circumstances. But experience again suggests that for most people sacrificial giving begins at five percent of income with proportions under five percent falling into the token giving category.

Church interest is often low, studies have shown, because investment is low. There is no sacrifice. It doesn't really cost anything. Jesus said, "Where

your treasure is, there will be your heart also." (Luke 12:34) Where is your treasure? That is where you will find your heart.

Call for Nominations

At our 2021 annual meeting in January, we will have elections for Congregation Council and for Voting Members of the NJ Synod Assembly. If you are interested in nominating someone or being nominated to serve in either of these capacities, please contact Emily Thomsen, congregation president.

Council Members commit to attending monthly council meetings and being active and present in the life of the congregation. Current council members whose first term is expiring are eligible for re-election. Two will be elected.

Synod Assembly Voting Members commit to attending the 2021 New Jersey Synod Assembly, and representing our congregation in the decision-making processes of the business of the synod (regional organization of Lutheran congregations in New Jersey). Costs of attendance are covered by the congregation. Two, preferably one man and one woman, will be elected.

Annual Reports & Meeting

The Annual Meeting of the congregation will be held virtually on **Sunday, January 31, 2020**, after worship; everyone is encouraged to participate. The Annual Meeting is the time when we tell the story of how God has been at work in this congregation during the past year and look forward to how our hands will engage in God's



mission in 2021. We'll vote on our 2021 Spending Plan and elect new church council members and Synod Assembly Voting Members.

If you are the leader of a ministry area at Holy Trinity, please submit (preferably via email) your Annual Report to the church office no later than Sunday, January 10th; the reports have to be put together, copied and mailed by Sunday, January 17 to ensure everyone has received one prior to the meeting on the 31st. *If not submitted in time, you will be responsible for printing & distributing your report.
